# **JOB SUMMARY:**

Position.

The Cultural Navigator will assist in empowering, engaging, organizing, and advocating on behalf of the multicultural population throughout San Miguel County. This individual will serve a key role in the development of Tri-County Health Network's (TCHNetwork's) advocacy and outreach efforts for underserved immigrants, people of color, and San Miguel County's non-English speakers (NES). Responsibilities include community engagement and outreach to the immigrant population, providing support, and linking individuals to identified resources. This position also serves as a referral resource for partner organizations that provide direct services to the immigrant population, offering responsive services to assist affected populations with navigating complex systems of care and local civics.

## **DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:**

May include the following, and other duties as assigned.

- 1. Outreach to and connect with the target population throughout the county
- 2. Research and maintain an extensive community resource list so that the target population have a point person to turn to that can refer them to the correct community resources/organizations
- 3. Undergo extensive training on immigration law and provide linguistically-competent immigration legal services to the area's immigrant population
- 4. Connect multicultural community members to resources to promote wellbeing, self- sufficiency, health, social engagement, and civic engagement
- 5. Work with our target population, identify service gaps, and develop solutions to fill those gaps
- 6. Develop/cultivate cross-referral relationships and actively collaborate with schools, county social services agency staff members, community and faith-based organizations, and other partners throughout the TCHNetwork service area to ensure multicultural population has access to holistic, inclusive, and culturally-appropriate services
- 7. Document all outreach and engagement efforts in TCHNetwork's tracking system.
- 8. Coordinate and facilitate the Latino/a Advocacy Committee (LAC) in San Miguel County and oversee the potential expansion throughout the tri-county region
- 9. Offer capacity building workshops to empower the target population to frame the narrative about equity in the county



- 10. Support and coach, as needed, the target population, to be their own advocates and voice their opinions
- 11. Assist with program outreach that address health equity including SKIPPY/SMILES, LAC, and Behavioral Health programming
- 12. Administer fund application assistance, eligibility interviews, application support, and necessary follow up
- 13. Provide general education regarding benefits of Medicaid, CHP+, and/or marketplace insurance and health service delivery to local multicultural populations
- 14. Successfully complete State of Colorado training to become a Certified Enrollment Assistant / Health Coverage Guide
- 15. Participate in required trainings, continuing education, and monthly conference calls
- 16. Keep up to date with social and political current events occurring locally as well as nationally that might affect our target population.
- 17. Translate Tri-County marketing and promotional materials are translated into Spanish
- 18. Other duties as required to ensure the success of the program and Network.

- A relevant four-year degree with emphasis in public health, social work, community engagement or other related field
- Two years' direct experience in advocacy or community engagement
